Miles 65 to 75 were hard and then it actually got a little better. After that, in terms of effort, I felt like I was holding a 7 minute pace but in reality, it was hardly a shuffle. I worked hard to avoid the dreaded "death march" by not permitting myself to walk unless climbing. Later I did resort to a speed walking pace, off and on, only because I came to the realization it was probably faster than what my running pace had become. Got passed by three people between 60 and 80 miles. After that, I wasn't passed again and I passed a dozen or more. This was a mental boost considering my geriatric pace.

Can't even explain the satisfaction I'm feeling right now. I sat on the plane and felt a sense of peace that I can only compare to what people refer to as a religious experience. Life is good.
